Here at school we are able to track our boxes to know where in the world they go and some children in school will have an opportunity to write letters to place inside the boxes. Our children will also be responsible for packing the boxes too before we send them off.

We would be delighted if families could support this appeal by donating the items below. Any families who are able to cover a shoe box with Christmas paper (lid and box wrapped separately please) would also be appreciated. If you're not able to wrap, just an empty shoebox would be great. To support the charity with transport costs, they also ask for a monetary donation and these can be placed in an envelope labelled 'Samaritans purse' if you would like to make a monetary donation. All donations need to be received in school by Monday 7th November.
