The Abbots Ripton School Council have been very busy this year. We started the year with fundraising. We arranged a sponsored walk and we raised about $\pounds1,000!$ We also organised a Christmas art competition and some of the entries were shown at the Christmas fair.

The School Council also entered the Rotary Club's competition to reduce waste and we came 2nd! We won a £30 Amazon voucher that we decided to give to our school librarians to buy new books.

We have also funded a library competition and bought new play equipment. Throughout the year, we have also been involved in The Young Leadership Course. Our biggest impact was our environment focus during the Spring term. We made posters to encourage people to turn off the taps and lights we have also taken part in the big plastic count. We have introduced green food waste bins that get emptied into compost, encouraged soft plastic recycling, arranged litter picking groups and held an assembly about recycling.

Due to the ever rising cost of food, the Governors have taken the decision to increase the price of a school meal to $\pounds 2.60$. This is still great value for the quality and quantity of food provided each day. Our meals meet the School Food Standard and are of a high quality – alongside fruit offered each day as well as bread which is often home made.

As a reminder, if your child is moving into Year 3, they will no longer receive a free meal at lunch time and they will also be able to make their own choice each day. We would encourage you to continue with hot meals as we believe that this is the best option for children.

Our current menu will remain in place until October half term.

E-books


