

- · We will keep your child safe




What can we expect from you?

What is the Foundation Stage?

The Foundation Stage is the stage of education from the age of three to the end of the Reception year.

It is based on the recognition that children learn best through planned purposeful play, creative thinking and active learning. At the end of the Reception year, children are assessed against 17 aspects of learning in the Foundation Stage Profile. It is hoped that each child will gain a Good Level of Development, and meet the expected requirements for each area.



Personal, Social and Emotional Development

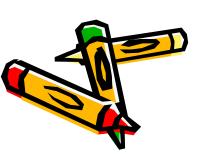




There are four *specific* areas of learning, through which the three prime areas are strengthened and applied:




Understanding the World

Use technology to follow simple programs, create pictures and take videos and pictures.







Expressive Arts and Design There will be opportunities to explore:

A day in the life of...

The day begins with changing a sharing book and a 'busy learning' task to support fine motor control.

Over the morning, there will be a phonics session, reading session and maths session. At the outset of the year, these sessions are short and practical. There is an opportunity to have a fruit snack and drink before we join the rest of the school for playtime at 10.30am and then for lunch at 12.

The afternoon will begin with a focus and the learning opportunities the children then have, are often linked to this focus. The resources in the classroom and outside area are usually available for the children to choose from, so they can develop their own ideas and interests.

After the Autumn half term, we end our day with whole school Collective Worship.

It would be a great help to us if your child was encouraged to do these things before starting school:

Dress and undress

Fasten their coat with either a zip or buttons

Take off and put on their shoes independently

Use the toilet independently

Use cutlery

Know a selection of nursery rhymes

Have opportunities to count

Starting arrangements

- Friday 6th September 30 minute drop in session to stay and play with your child in the classroom. This will be in small groups of 3 or 4 children. You will be able to sign up for a time. (9am 9.30am, 9.45am 10.15am, 11am 11:30am, 1.15pm 1.45pm or 2pm 2.30pm. We ask that you bring all of your child's belongings which will be left in school e.g. their bag with a change of clothes, waterproofs and wellies etc. to this session.
- Monday 9th September and Tuesday 10th September half of the children will come in 9:30am until 11:30am and
 half will come in 1pm until 3pm. Please see your pack for
 when your child is invited.
- Wednesday 11th September All children in 8:50am until 12.30pm
- Thursday 12th September All in full time.


PLEASE label all items of clothing!

Please provide your child with:

- School Uniform
- A PE Kit black shorts, plain black or blue school jumper and black jogging bottoms, white T-shirt, trainers
- A spare set of clothes including a pair of pants and socks (to be kept in school)
- A pair of wellington boots
- Waterproof over trousers
- · A coat and water bottle in school at all times
- A school book bag

Fruit and vegetable snacks are provided free for all Reception and Key Stage 1 children.

- Cows Milk is provided free for all under 5 years. Parents need to complete the registration form in the pack and pass it back to school if milk is required.
- If your child is poorly please make contact with the school office.
- If your child is going home with someone else not on their contact list, please inform the school office.
