	In this essential skills and knowledge project, we will locate countries and cities, and use grid references, compass points and latitude and longitude. We will discover the five major climate zones. We will look at significant places in the United Kingdom and carry out fieldwork to discover how land is used in the locality.	
Music	In Music, we will be learning the Young Voices songs and learning to sing in parts. Alongside this, we will be learning about music notation using the stave and treble clef.

	 On Fridays, Kandinsky will be completing obtact problem solving activities which will involve cooperation, communication and consideration. On Fridays, Kandinsky will have a specialist dance teacher and our focus will be on creating and performing dance compositions. 	
Computing	Digital Literacy Year 3 – We will review online activity, including maintaining/amending online profiles without sharing personal details. We will learn to show respect for content created by others. We will identify a range of online risks including inappropriate contact or content and identify ways of reporting/ seeking support.	



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French	 Year 4 - Online Safety – We will consider our online identity and that of others, including how some people may not be who they seem online. We will think about our own behaviour online and how this impacts our reputations. We will consider ways bullying may occur online and how to deal with this including considering ways to ensure our own behaviour is kind and acceptable. We will look at different methods used to encourage people to make online purchases and consider the reliability of information we read online. We will think about our own screen time usage and how to recognise when we might need time away. Our French lessons will be taught by Mrs Crossan who is a native French speaker. We will continue with our unit 'Les instruments'. We will learn the names for lots of instruments and we will be able to say, "I play" plus an instrument. In addition, we will learn about different aspects of French culture including some French Christmas traditions.
Please remember	 Reading diaries and reading books should be in school daily. PE Kits should be worn on Tuesday and Friday. Mathletics home learning will be set each week – please try to complete this each week. This is a really important opportunity for the children to consolidate and reinforce the learning that has taken place in class and should not take the children any more than 20 minutes per week. TI Rockstars is also a great resource provided by school and just 10 minutes each day will really improve vital skills in times tables including the inverse division facts. As the weather gets wetter please send in a pair of outdoor shoes (in a named plastic bag) that can be worn on the field and get wet (wellies or old trainers are good). Please ensure that children have a warm coat to wear.
