	 Writing Handwriting We will continue to use the Little Wandle letter formation sheets to support correct letter formation. Spelling We learn to segment words into sounds and count each sound to help spell words phonetically in our daily phonics lessons. Spelling also includes the spelling of the tricky words. Take One Book- As a whole school we are using the book by 'Here we are' by Oliver Jeffers to generate some vocabulary to describe how we are all special and unique. We will also use the texts, 'Peace at Last' by Jill Murphy, 'Owl Babies ' by Martin Waddell, 'The Gruffalo's Child' and information books about Bats and Nocturnal animals to develop our ability to write labels and captions for story maps and short simple sentences. 		
Maths	Our themes for this half term in Number are Alive in Five and Growing 6, 7, 8. We will be comparing and composing numbers to 8, including the number zero. We use the Number blocks, ten frames and Numicon to support our understanding. We will continue to practise subitising amounts to help us with our counting and we will explain our understanding. 	How can we help others when they need it? This unit is the first of two underpinned by the idea of 'salvation' as expressed in the Christian faith. Salvation means 'being rescued' or 'offering help'. We will all be a class superhero for the day, and our learning will be centred around what the bible says about helping others in the story of The Good Samaritan, and how the Christian community lives out what the bible says through prayer and working together as a community.	
Expressive Arts and Design	Creating with materials We will continue to explore different media and resources in the classroom and outdoor area. We will experiment with mixing light and dark colours, looking carefully at the special features of owls when we create an owl collage and develop our design skills when we create a cuddle pet for bedtime and become rocket builders! Being imaginative and expressive Our music lesson will be on alternate Monday's this half term and we will continue to learn how to play the tuned bells. We will sing songs and rhymes linked to our topic and in Maths.	
Personal Development	 We will have an indoor PE lesson on Monday. This is a gymnastic lesson and will cover making simple body shapes, learning to hold these shapes and then link a sequence of shapes together. Our Friday PE lesson is an outdoor adventure lesson in the Wild Wood. Each child will continue to follow the Fizzy Programme which focusses on balance, coordination and ball skills. 	
PSHE	This term we are increasing opportunities in the classroom for independence. We encourage the children to tidy up after themselves, look after their belongings, and carry out simple daily tasks like changing the calendar and organising the fruit at snack time. PSHE Our lessons have a citizenship theme and explore ways to value differences and understand different ways of life. Many of these themes will be explored through stories; 'Suki's Kimono', 'Susan Laughs' and 'Elmer.'
