Our Remembrance Week

Last week the children had the opportunity to reflect on the impact of war and to remember and give thanks to those who fought and died in the first and second world wars. Picasso class were moved to learn about the brave people from Abbots Ripton who fought and some who died. They visited the plaque in the church and thought about what life might have been like. All children made a poppy; some were printed using sliced fruit, some were collaged and some were folded to create a poppy windmill effect. These are now on display in school.

A huge thank you to the families who shared their family links with the war and for allowing the children to see some of the war time artefacts including medals. It makes history come alive when it relates to people that they are able to make a connection with.

Parent Drop In sessions

As a school we acknowledge the importance of positive wellbeing not just in our children and staff but also in the parent community. With this in mind, we are really pleased that we now have

a link Early Intervention Family Worker who will be providing a drop in session each half term here at school. There is no need to make an appointment, you can just come along and have a chat. The aim of these drop ins is to support parents with anything that they may want advice about; it could be how to manage sibling rivalry, what strategies to use with a child who is a fussy eater or a bed wetter and so on. It may also just be that you want to talk someone who is not connected to the school who will be a confidential listening ear. Our first Parent Drop in session is between 2pm and 3pm on 29th

School Hot Dinner - Picasso

Currently any children having a packed lunch, who are in Picasso class, have their lunch in a classroom. Following discussion with Jo in our kitchen, we have decided that each half term we will select half the class to eat in the classroom and half the class to eat in the school hall. However, we are aware that children who are eating in the classroom all opt for a packed lunch but we are now able to serve a hot meal even if your child is eating in a classroom. Hopefully this may mean that children who want to eat with their friends can still have a choice about which meal they have, particularly as so many parents would prefer them to eat a hot meal.

Awesome Arctic workshop

Monet and Van Gogh will meet a real explorer next week! He has spent a great deal of time exploring the Arctic and he will share his equipment as well as photographs with the children alongside sharing his amazing stories about his time in this amazing part of our planet.

Golden Mile

During this term the children have been participating in The Golden Mile, an all year round initiative whereby they are encouraged to walk, jog or run around the 'Golden Mile track' on the school field during lunch times. We would like to give the children an opportunity to take part in this initiative before school each day. Therefore, starting on Monday, children and parents will be able to arrive at school from 8:30am, and complete as many laps as possible before 8:45am to give themselves a healthy and active start to the day. Parents will remain responsible for their children until 8:40am so will be



encouraged to walk, jog or run with them. The route has been measured so we will mark out the lap with cones for next week until everyone becomes familiar with the route. All laps will be recorded on our page on the Premier Portal and this is then converted into total miles completed. Each child will receive a personalised certificate when they reach the 10, 25, 50, 75, 100, and 150 mile mark! There is no need for your child to change into sports kit for this activity.
