After School Club Provision

We wrote to parents at the end of last term regarding our after-school club provision. As promised, we have spent this half term investigating options and meeting with providers in order to secure the greatest range of clubs and with the highest quality providers.



I am delighted that we have sourced some providers who are able to start after half term and one who can start after Easter.

Starting on **Monday 20th February** we will have Primary Sports Stars running a football club for Years 3 to 6 and from **Wednesday 22nd** they will run a Multi-sports club for Years 1 to 4. The flyer with prices, booking details, how to pay etc. is attached and the booking form can also be accessed <u>here</u>.

We have also attached a letter which asks for an expression of interest in recorder club, singing club, art club or French club. This is an external provider who will run all or some of these clubs depending on the viability so please do return your expression of interest. We are hopeful that these clubs will start week beginning **Monday 6th March**. Once we have received the expression of interests, we will let parents know which of the clubs are running and on which days of the week.

Lastly, we have secured a gymnastics club run by <u>Twisters</u> who are a highly regarded local club based in Perry. They are not able to start until the Summer term but their club will run on a Thursday after school for Years 1 to 6. We will send further details about how this can be booked nearer the time.

Places for all clubs are limited so please do book early and **please do send your** expression of interest by Monday 20th February at the latest. Any family who is concerned about meeting the costs of clubs please contact Mrs Matthews as we have a small amount of funding to support families if needed.

Also, a reminder that if any parents have a particular passion or skill that they would be happy to share in an after-school club, please do come and speak to us.
