
What can you expect from us?

What can we expect from you?


- To ensure that your child attends school regularly, is on time and has the right equipment/kit

What is the Foundation Stage?

The Foundation Stage is from the age of three to the end of the Reception year.

It is based on the recognition that children learn best through planned purposeful play, creative thinking and active learning. At the end of the Reception year, children are assessed against 17 aspects of learning in the Foundation Stage Profile. It is hoped that each child will gain a Good Level of Development, and meet the expected requirements for each area.





Seven areas of learning


The **prime** areas are:

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

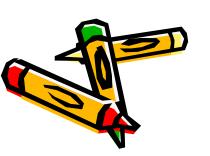




There are four **specific** areas of learning, through which the three prime areas are strengthened and applied:

Characteristics of Learning


Playing and exploring

Personal, Social and Emotional Development Your child will learn how to:

- Be self-confident
- Develop social skills and how to manage their feelings
- Form positive relationships and develop respect for others
- Understand appropriate behaviour

- Know what their own needs are






Communication and Language

Your child will learn how to:

- -Listen and talk confidently and clearly in a range of situations

- -Develop their confidence and skills in expressing themselves






Physical Development

- Understand why it's important to make healthy choices






Literacy

- Begin to develop mark making skills using a variety of different resources






Mathematics

Your child will be provided with opportunities to:


- Develop and improve their skills in counting and subitising up to 5

- Use everyday language linked to time, money, shape, fractions and measure




Understanding the World

- Use technology to follow simple programs, create pictures and take videos and pictures.







Expressive Arts and Design






Starting arrangements
