






Little Wandle for parents</p> <p>Handwriting</p> <p>We will continue to use the Little Wandle letter formation sheets to support correct letter formation and remember to check our position, posture and pencil grip before we write. We always warm up our hands before we write.</p> <p>Spelling</p> <p>We learn to segment words into sounds and count each sound to help spell words phonetically in our daily phonics lessons. 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<p>Maths</p> 	<p>Our themes for this half term in Number are Alive in Five and Growing 6, 7, 8.</p> <p>We will be comparing and composing numbers to 8, including the number zero. We use the Number blocks, ten frames and numicon to support our understanding. We also use our fingers to make numbers and support the composing and decomposing of numbers</p> <p>We will continue to practise subitising amounts to help us with our counting and will be encouraged to explain our understanding.</p> <p>Measure: Comparing lengths and heights and exploring capacity and mass.</p>																		
<p>Understanding the World</p> 	<p>Starry Starry Night-This project explores the differences in the world at night compared to during the day. It teaches children about the importance of a good night's sleep, and helps them to discover what is happening in the world while they are sleeping, including finding out about nocturnal animals.</p>																		



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	<p>Winter Wonderland-This project teaches children about the changes that happen during winter, including the types of weather associated with this season. It also explores places that have snow all year round and the types of animals that live there.</p>   <p>We will also use our outdoor area to watch the seasons change and hope to plant bulbs and seeds in a variety of different containers. We will take part in the Big Schools Bird Watch 2026 in the last week of January. We are very lucky to have 'Miss Ann' help us on a Friday afternoon, and she shares her love and knowledge of the outside world with us.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">RE</p> 	<p>How can we help others when they need it?</p> <p>This unit is the first of two underpinned by the idea of 'salvation' as expressed in the Christian faith. Salvation means 'being rescued' or 'offering help'. We will all be a class superhero for the day, and our learning will be centred about what the Bible says about helping others in the story of the Good Samaritan, and how the Christian community lives out what the Bible says through prayer and working together as a community.</p>
<p>Expressive Arts and Design</p> 	<p>Creating with materials</p> <p>We will continue to explore different media and resources in the classroom and outdoor area, and will experiment with mixing light and dark colours, looking carefully at the special features of owls when we create an owl collage and will develop our design skills when we create a cuddle pet for bedtime and become rocket builders!</p> <p>Being imaginative and expressive</p> <p>We will continue to build our repertoire of songs, and will learn about lullabies as we think about a good night's sleep!</p> <p>Our role play area will be a superhero writing station, and a home role play area.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">PD</p> 	<p>We will have an indoor PE lesson on Monday. This is a gymnastic lesson and will cover making simple body shapes, learning to hold these shapes and then link a sequence of shapes together.</p> <p>We hope to continue with our visits to the Wild Wood on a Wednesday. The activity in this space gives lots of opportunity for climbing and negotiating space, as well as observing season change and the weather.</p> <p>Each child will continue to follow the Fizzy Programme which focusses on balance, coordination and ball skills.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">PSHE</p>	<p>This term we are increasing opportunities in the classroom for independence. We encourage the children to tidy up after themselves, look after their belongings, and carry out simple daily tasks like changing the calendar and organising the fruit at snack time. We will have a daily 'Superhero helper' who will help out with everyday tasks.</p>




