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History	The Great Fire of London – As part of our Geography learning about London, the children will learn about the causes and the impact of the fire on the city of London in 1666. They will learn about the key events that led up to the fire as well as about the monument to the Great Fire of London.
Art and Design	Flora and Fauna - The children will be introduced to the idea that many artists use flora and fauna to inspire their work. We will look at artists who used drawing as a way to accurately capture the way plants and insects look, and artists who use their imagination to create their own versions of flora and fauna. We will spend time engaged in close looking as a way to build drawing skills. We will also practise cutting and collage skills and explore shape and colour to build images.
Computing Green Screen by Do Ink	 Year 1 - Photo Editing and Green Screen Technology The children will learn to take photos using a device and then take photos against a green screen and with support, they will add a background using the app, Do Ink. They will then crop and apply filters in the iPad photos app. The unit also supports an understanding that some images are not real and how they were created. Year 2 - Presenting information - Word The children will learn how to type using a keyboard in Microsoft Word and the basics of manipulating text including how to change font and text size, adding spaces, new lines, full stops, capital letters, question and exclamations marks.
	The children will listen and reflect on the orchestral piece of music titled: Short Ride in a Fast Machine by John Adams. They will invent their own musical motifs and structure inspired by Adams' composition and turn them into a short composition of their own. Together they will perform as an ensemble using percussion and tuned instruments.
PSHE E	Citizenship - Working Together. The children will examine their strengths when communicating in a group and be able to identify a new skill to develop. They will understand and practise group work skills, including discussion, negotiation and co-operation. We will also be covering the unit, Financial Capabilities to know how to save and look after their money & why we might do so. The children will begin to understand the difference between wants and needs and the need for informed choices. They will begin to understand family spending and the impact of choices.
PE	PE – Indoor PE will be a Gymnastics unit with a specialist teacher. The children will continue to practise and perform using points and patches in a variety of ways to balance. This term the children will work towards an in-class gymnastics competition. Games will continue to focus on fundamental movement skills unit 2. The children will be practising and performing multi-skills that relate to a range of games including throwing, catching, sending and receiving.
Please remember	 Year 1 - You may want to leave a set of spare clothing in school for your child. Please can we request that this comes in to school in named plastic bags with each piece of clothing named individually, in order that we can return all items. Year 1 - Please bring your sharing books to school in a book bag as these fit into the children's drawers – no rucksacks please. Sharing books will be changed at the beginning of each morning. Most – Please access your child's Big Cat Collins e-book online. Pupils will have practised this book 3 times on Monday-Wednesday. Afterwards, it will be released and ready for your child to read at home. Books should be read a



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minimum of 3 times to ensure fluency. We welcome comments to be written in your child's reading diary to let us know how they are reading independently.
Year 1 – Practise your weekly graphemes, spelling words and tricky words and
bring your book into school every Thursday .
Year 2 – Practise your weekly spelling words and prickly words and bring your book into school every Friday.
Year 2 – If you have taken a break from TT Rocks Stars, now would be a great time to log in again as the children are beginning to formally learn their 2s, 5s, and 10s times tables in school. Log in details are in the reading diaries. All - Indoor PE kit (with warm joggers over the top) on a Wednesday and Friday. Although we hope to be outdoors on a Wednesday, having their indoor kit underneath is helpful if we may stay inside due to the weather. Please remember no jewellery for PE days (earrings should be removed or covered) and long hair must be tied back. Thank you.
All - Water bottles will be sent home on a Friday and need to be returned to school on a Monday.
All – the children will have a Mathletics task to complete each week. Their log
in details can be found in their reading diaries. This learning supports our class
learning as we release units as we teach them in school. Please try to do this
each week as it should only take about 10-15 minutes.
